Busy REinspired Caversham

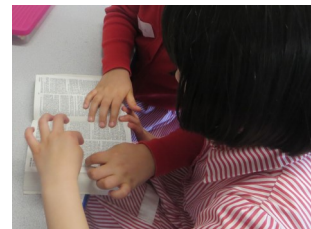

The brief was to look at things within the church that helped believers engage in worship. We had a really enjoyable session where, after hearing some fascinating facts about what was on the site before the church and why the church had a bell, we linked our 5 senses to items and experiences within the church.

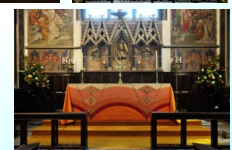
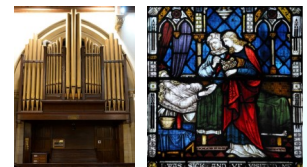
Sound :: The church organist treated us to a variety of live organ music

Sight :: We looked at the Bible on the lectern and the stained glass windows

Smell :: We saw how infant baptism used anointing oils

Touch :: Holding rosaries and crosses

Taste :: While discussing Holy Communion the students had an opportunity to taste some bread and grape juice



At each station, the students put their thoughts onto a worksheet to present to others in their year group back at school. They really enjoyed the session and most commented that they hadn't realised how much the senses were involved in worship. The teachers were delighted and were keen to come again - maybe also with a Year 10 group. Many thanks to Revs Philip and Hannah, Alison, Elaine and David the organist for all their support.

Hello from REinspired Woodley

In the Spring our volunteers got together to have an in-house training session. We looked at what we do and why we do it and explored some of the lessons coming up in the term. It was a real encouragement to hear our volunteers' voice to what they felt their role was:

- ◆ Enable the lesson to happen
- ◆ Supporting the theme
- ◆ Listen to the children — we're like a garden with lots of different flowers

The summer term always has a mix of different lessons: Miracles; What's so special about the Bible, Prayer stations, Religious artefacts, How Christians respond to global issues — playing the banana split game. I'm always blown away at children's responses during the prayer stations — 'ask God any question' brings up questions about forgiveness, justice, why God allows bad things to happen — deep questions from 8 and 9 year olds.

During the year we ran a prayer station session with Yr6's thinking about transition. We had 5 stations: **Sorry** — which looked at regrets, **WOW** — celebrating positive memories of their time at school, **Please** — thinking about things that they feel worried or anxious about, **Thank you** — remembering people who have helped them at school, **making a jigsaw** to remember they are unique, special and all have a part to play.
