We started the term wondering if our schools would have the appetite or headspace for REinspired sessions, and if they did, we wondered how on earth would we deliver it. Like the rest of the world, we moved online. The response from our schools, after a tentative start, has been overwhelmingly positive. Our schools love the pre-recorded sessions we have created and the accompanying craft packs. Staff have been hugely appreciative of our efforts, more than I have ever experienced, and the children have been excited to see us, even though it's virtually on the whiteboard. Years of being on the schools' landscape, the trust and relationships that have been built along the way has really helped this to happen. We truly are, all in this together.

The uptake here in Earley and East Reading has exceeded our expectations meaning we have a full diary for next term with 44 primary and 3 secondary sessions (21 classes) booked in already. Mostly pre-recorded with a few hoping to be able to invite the Team Leader in to teach from the front.

Thank you for your continued prayers, encouragement, and financial support. Knowing you are with us in spirit has kept us going.

Thank you to our Team for bravely stepping way out of their comfort zone, take the IT 'bull by the horns' and getting it done. There has been a certain amount of 'grinding and gnashing of teeth', not going to lie; we are more 'in the room' type of people as opposed to IT/media specialists. But, we have stepped out in faith and have grown in the process. We long (and wait) for when we can return in person.

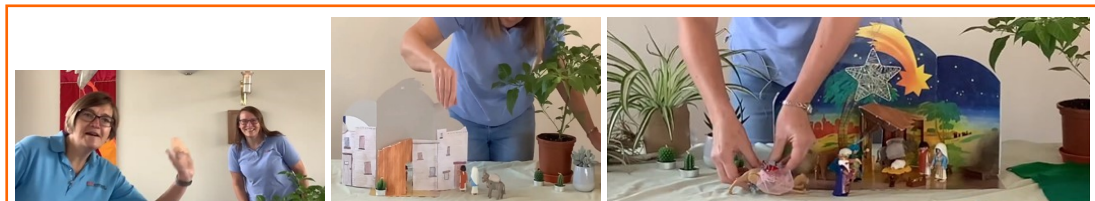

REinspired is back in class

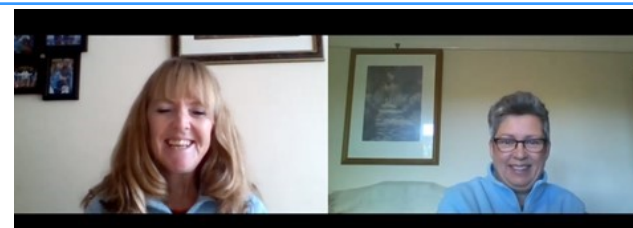
What is it like being in schools now? First of all, the children and I don't have the benefit of, our lovely volunteers – it is a big loss to the children not to have that close contact with a real live Christian – it is so often in the groups where the children have the courage to ask big questions and to receive a personal answer. I really miss that interaction. It is also hard to see a child asking for help and not be able to go to them!



So far I have delivered one session in the classroom, but the second lockdown has meant we have had to move it online instead. However, the teachers have been brilliant, and need all of our encouragement and prayers just now. I am finding the technical side of things challenging as I grapple with all sorts of new things, but as a team we are overcoming any issues and supporting each other. As we can't do the dramas live, Hollywood has come to Earley (sort of) and we've made some great videos whilst keeping 2m apart!! And, I've managed to use toy actors. loved it! Creating new ways of reaching the children, although challenging, is certainly bringing joy and laughter into the classroom!

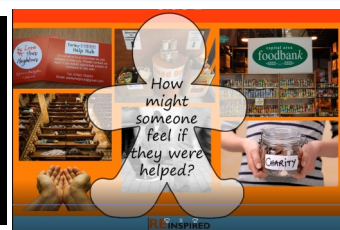
May God bless you this Christmas and into 2021.
