Yr5 'Salvation' Understanding Christianity

One of the Understanding Christianity 'Salvation' units with Earley St Peters Yr5 answers 'What did Jesus do to save human beings?'.

I began retelling Holy week whilst a table was laid for the 'Last Supper', surrounded by all 70 pupils. As I read the story pupils and volunteers considered how the disciples would have felt that evening.

In small groups, pupils discussed whether they had been 'saved' from anything, leading to a sorting activity thinking about what Christians believe Jesus saved us from.

A quiet response time followed, as they thought about what 'saved' means to them - what does it look like? What colour, shape or pattern is 'saved'?

Well, they gave me some amazing personal responses!

They went on to learn about the Old Testament sacrifice, that a lamb was a temporary sacrifice which had to be

repeated but that Jesus' death was a permanent, once and for all sacrifice.

To finish the session we saw a clip from the Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe where Aslan sacrifices himself to save Narnia.



Staff said that it was an 'insightful session furthering the pupils' understanding of this unitwhich was very interesting and enjoyable'.

We have allowed more time for students to ask us questions about our thoughts on heaven and hell, who might go to which, where we find things in the Bible that help us decide what is true about this.

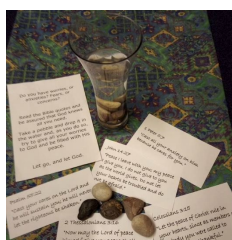
Their responses in discussion time have been thoughtful saying that, if there is a heaven, they think it would be calm, peaceful, no wars, colourful, and where we will be happy.

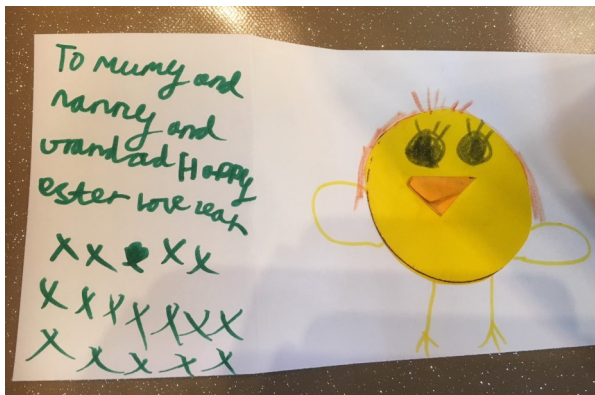
PRAYERFUL: Lots of people lingered relaxing as they prayed and watched their 'bubble prayers' rise to heaven.

Easter Sessions Yr 1-3



I joined REinspired as a team leader in September 2019; consequently, I had only done a few live sessions before covid chaos - the run up to Easter this year has been amazing. For my two primary schools I had 8 different sessions booked over 3 weeks - a challenge but a huge blessing at the same time.

Many of the teachers had never experienced an REinspired session before and all were very positive about what we had done, both on a personal level and on behalf of their students.

Several children have commented something like "this is the best lesson ever", or even "I want to stay here forever". Many of the Y1 & Y2 children have never heard the Easter story before.

In one of the sessions, we tell the story of Good Friday from the front, then go to groups for a craft. The children return to the front to hear the surprising events of Easter Day. On returning to the group for the next craft, I had one little boy who very excitedly declared "I never expected the story to end like that!"

It is such a huge privilege to be there at moments like this - of which there are many, and many of which we pray will have eternal significance!

Over the last two years the team has evolved as you would expect, and we are currently seeking additional volunteers. If you have a morning or afternoon free, enjoy sharing your faith and working with children or teenagers, we would love to welcome you to the REinspired family - it is great fun and very rewarding.
