'Why did Jesus die?' The question came from a child in a session on salvation, one of many sessions in the lead up to Easter. What a wonderful question to be asked! A range of answers flash through my mind. What is the best way to reply? Should I say – a sacrifice? A ransom? To forgive our sins? All of these are true, but are they helpful right now? So, in the end I realise what I need to say: "Jesus died on the cross because he loved us."

#### **Yr8 Religious Experience**

This term Yr8 students have been thinking about to what extent a person's purpose in life is determined by their understanding of God, within the context of a religious experience.

They had fun playing a game of matching 'silly' experiences with possible consequences. They discussed whether consequences are dependent on the experience, and which has more value - the experience or the consequence.

Each group then studied a Christian religious experience and the resulting consequence: the conversion of Paul and Silas' jailer and Brother Andrew to Christianity, and the saving of addicts and violent gangs by Jackie Pullinger.

We saw that religious experiences prompted



love and kindness and so changed many people's lives for the better. Students realised that it was by showing the true nature of lesus to those who were helpless and hopeless, people had a areater understanding of God, which had a definite impact on their purpose in life.
