modelling or simply writing a poem.



Please remember our work in your prayers as we prepare for another year of REinspired.







90 Year 1 & 2 pupils from Aldryngton school, visited Earley St Peter's church to hear the story of 'Creation'.

They enjoyed a presentation of some amazing photos from nature to inspire them, followed by an interactive storytelling where they acted 'growing, flying, splashing, walking and crawling things' along with the 'sun, moon, stars, Adam and Eve'. This set the scene to go into smaller groups around the church to hear and see the story of Creation played out in Godly Play style.



Afterwards the pupils had a discussion about which day they liked the best, which was most important and whether we could do without any of

the days.

In response to 'Why do we have the 7th day, a day of rest' one pupil said, "to thank God for creating life and for us to enjoy Creation". Another responded with "To stop working and look at what we've got".

Profound thoughts from 6 and 7 year olds.

Pupils then had the opportunity to respond to the story through artwork or writing. They shared what they had made

with each other and thought about ways in which they can look after this wonderful world we live in. They thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity of time to just create - evident in their fantastic creations!




My personal favourite is when we are asked to talk about prayer, especially the Lords Prayer, using Godly Play. It is rich and deep. Stimulates imagination and conversation. Different lines in the prayer landing differently with each child, with some of the artefacts cleverly drawing connections to memories they have of previous sessions.

This year, many children were particularly drawn to this part -

'Your Heavenly Father loves you so much, that he has spread his love to every corner of the world. North, south, east and west.

Yr7 Spirituality & Art

This term we have been looking at "Spirituality and Art" with the 10 classes of year 7 in Bulmershe school. How could Sister Wendy Beckett's quote be true, "Looking at art is a way of listening to God"?



After looking at some examples of historical Christian painting, we spent more time with two pieces by Sue Batchelor, a contemporary local artist, seeing how she combined different Christian themes into a single abstract image.

One of the key questions we addressed in small groups was, "Why did Sue Batchelor express her spirituality through art?".

Responses from year 7's included:

- "Some things are too powerful to be described in words"
- "I want to show my thoughts on God in a creative way"
- "So she could spread the word"

The students engaged really well with this session which is rather different from their usual RS lessons. As one volunteer commented, "I was so impressed at the young people's enthusiasm and insight as we

talked about spiritual journeys and where God can fit into people's lives."
